If a church or cathedral possessed some such piece of material memory everything else about that church was enhanced in the minds of the faithful. So important were these "relics" that a lively commercial trade was carried on and livelihoods, not to say fortunes, were sustained by that commerce. Even as such relics were adored as genuine, everybody knew that there were enough "pieces of the true cross" to build a good number of barns.

Ordinarily these bits of memorabilia were kept securely in a reliquary, a room or case dedicated to the maintenance of the relic(s). But at least once a year, that changed.

On All-Saints Day the relics were removed from safe keeping and displayed in public procession through the streets of the city or town. The procession was accompanied by crowds and great celebration. The evening before the procession was a time of preparation and anticipation. It was All-Hallows Eve, and it has become our Halloween.

For the Christian, Halloween is no more about ghosts and witches than Easter is about bunnies and eggs. We don't need the relics, genuine or fake. We <u>could</u> benefit from some appreciative memory of those who, going before us, have left a

faith that we can embrace and celebrate. And we can resolve to do the same for those who come after us.
